Brief: have a minimum of **10% post-consumer** recycled content in new collections to be sold in stores before the end of 2018

Process almost completed with **9 pilots** set up with both fashion brands and workwear companies

2018 – Completion of all pilots, evaluation and lessons learned

2019 – Launch of web-based F2F toolkit
